



Library Program Policy

Programming is an integral part of the many services provided for the community by the Lomira QuadGraphics Community Library.

A library program is a planned event between a program facilitator and/or library staff member(s) and the program participants for the purpose of promoting library materials, facilities, or services as well as offering the community an informational, entertaining, or cultural experience.

Library programming utilizes library staff, outside speakers, books, library and community resources, displays, and media presentations. Programming includes such activities as storytimes, crafts or other hands-on activities, speakers, lectures, demonstrations, book discussion groups and films.

Selection of library program topics, speakers, classes, and resource materials will be made by library staff to meet the needs and interests of library users and the community. Library programming will not exclude topics, books, speakers, media, and other resources because they might be controversial.

Some programs may be limited to a given number of participants, due to space limitations or if the nature of the program so demands.

No fee or donation is charged or solicited for programs presented. Only in a class or workshop may the participant be charged the cost of materials used. Exceptions may be made for activities of the Library, Friends of Lomira QuadGraphics Community Library and other activities deemed appropriate by the Library Director and/or Library Board of Trustees.
